## A BILL

- To amend the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008 to provide employment and training data grants, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "SNAP E&T Data And
- 5 Technical Assistance (DATA) Act of 2025".

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## 1 SEC. 2. AMENDMENT.

2 Section 5 of the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008 (7
3 U.S.C. 2014) is amended by adding at the end the fol4 lowing:

5 "(0) Employment and Training Data Grants.— The Secretary is authorized to award grants to State 6 7 agencies, on a competitive basis, for the purpose of creating and strengthening longitudinal administrative data-8 9 bases and associated resources for the purpose of strengthening program quality, reducing burden, advanc-10 11 ing equity, protecting privacy, and improving transparency in supplemental nutrition and assistance program employ-12 13 ment and training programs.

- 14 "(1) AWARD BASIS.—The Secretary shall award
  15 grants on a competitive basis and in a manner con16 sistent with the following priorities:
- 17 "(A) Encouraging participation among
  18 States that have not yet received such grants
  19 and among those with the greatest needs in
  20 terms of data infrastructure.

21 "(B) Strengthening effectiveness in meet22 ing the purposes of section 6(d)(4)(A)(i).

23 "(C) Facilitating co-enrollment and coordi24 nation of services between employment and
25 training programs offered under this Act and
26 other federally-supported workforce develop-

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1	ment programs, such as those authorized under
2	the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act
3	(29 U.S.C. 3101 et seq.) and the Strengthening
4	Career and Technical Education for the 21st
5	Century Act (Public Law 115–224; 132 Stat.
6	1563) and the amendments made by that Act.
7	"(D) Participating in and contributing
8	data to the State's linked longitudinal data sys-
9	tem, including submitting data that when
10	linked with K–12, postsecondary, and workforce
11	development data, provides the State with the
12	ability to create more robust tools and ana-
13	lytics.
14	"(E) Encouraging the use of non-Federal
15	contributions to improve State data infrastruc-
16	ture and related resources.
17	"(F) Enabling research and program im-
18	provement activities.
19	"(G) Other priorities as determined by the
20	Secretary.
21	"(2) PRIVACY AND SECURITY STANDARDS.—
22	Data supported by this subsection shall be—
23	"(A) used only for the purpose described in
24	this subsection;

1	"(B) exempted from the disclosure require-
2	ments of section 552(a) of title 5 of the United
3	States Code pursuant to section $552(b)(3)$ of
4	such title, to the extent such information is ob-
5	tained or received by the Secretary;
6	"(C) used in a manner that protects the
7	identity and location of an individual that is an
8	applicant for, or recipient of, supplemental nu-
9	trition assistance program benefits; and
10	"(D) shall meet security standards as de-
11	termined by the Secretary.
12	"(3) SUPPLEMENT NOT SUPPLANT.—Funds
13	made available under this subsection shall be used to
14	supplement, and not supplant, other State or local
15	funds used for developing State data systems.
16	"(4) Authorization of appropriations.—Of
17	the funds available under section 18, the Secretary
18	shall use to carry out this subsection \$15,000,000
19	for each of the fiscal years 2026 through 2030.
20	"(5) Administrative costs.—The Secretary
21	shall reserve not more than 20 percent of the funds
22	made available under paragraph (4) for the provi-
23	sion of technical assistance to support the implemen-
24	tation of these Grants.

1	"(6) REPORTS.—Not later than 3 years after
2	the effective date of this subsection, and annually
3	thereafter, the Secretary shall submit to the Com-
4	mittee on Agriculture of the House of Representa-
5	tives and the Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition,
6	and Forestry of the Senate, a report regarding im-
7	plementation of this subsection that, includes the
8	following information.
9	"(A) The number of grants awarded, a list
10	of recipients, and the amount of funds awarded.
11	"(B) A description of recipients' use of the
12	grant funds.
13	"(C) An analysis of the impact of receiving
14	such grants on improving the effectiveness of
15	State employment and training programs in
16	meeting the purposes of section $6(d)(4)(A)(i)$ .".
17	SEC. 3. GAO REPORT.
18	Not later than 1 year after funds are made available
19	to carry out section 5(0) of the Food and Nutrition Act
20	of 2008 (7 U.S.C. 2014(o)), the Comptroller General of
21	the United States shall—
22	(1) examine and review the implementation of
23	such section, including an examination of—

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(A) co-enrollment strategies and relatedbest practices that maximize participant eligi-bility using linked and integrated data;

(B) an examination and distillation of best practices related to the coordination and braiding of funds that improve the quality of employment and training programs implemented under the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008; and

9 (C) additional issues and impact that ac-10 cess to linked and integrated databases and the 11 development of data exchange agreements have 12 on the participant and provider outcomes within 13 employment and training programs imple-14 mented under the Food and Nutrition Act of 15 2008;

16 (2) develop recommendations to the Secretary
17 of Agriculture on any changes that should be made
18 to improve such data grants; and

(3) prepare and submit a report on the findings
and recommendations based on the examination
made under paragraph (1), and recommendations
received, under paragraph (2), to—

23 (A) the Committee on Agriculture, Nutri-24 tion, and Forestry of the Senate; and

(B) the Committee on Agriculture of the
 House of Representatives.
