A BILL

To require the Secretary of Agriculture to carry out certain
activities relating to research for wood products, and
for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Timber Innovation for
5 Building Rural Communities Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. DEFINITION OF SECRETARY.**

2 In this Act, the term “Secretary” means the Sec-
3 retary of Agriculture, acting through the Chief of the For-
4 est Service.

5 **SEC. 3. FOREST AND WOOD PRODUCTS DATA PROVISION.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary, in collaboration
7 with the Chief of the Natural Resources Conservation
8 Service and in consultation with federally recognized In-
9 dian Tribes, State foresters, and private sector partners,
10 shall establish a platform to provide measurement, moni-
11 toring, verification, and reporting data regarding the car-
12 bon emissions, sequestration, storage, and related atmos-
13 pheric impacts of forest management and wood products.

14 (b) ACTIVITIES.—In carrying out subsection (a), the
15 Secretary shall source data, information, and data anal-
16 ysis from Department of Agriculture programs, includ-
17 ing—

- 18 (1) the Forest Inventory and Analysis program;
- 19 (2) the Timber Products Output survey;
- 20 (3) Forest Service and Natural Resources Con-
21 servation Service soil carbon estimations;
- 22 (4) Department of Agriculture entity-level guid-
23 ance;
- 24 (5) the Forest Products Laboratory;
- 25 (6) the Federal Life Cycle Assessment Com-
26 mons;

1 (7) Department of Agriculture entity level
2 guidelines; and

3 (8) other relevant programmatic data and infor-
4 mation sources, as they are published and made
5 available.

6 (c) PRIORITIES.—The platform established by sub-
7 section (a) shall provide tools that calculate—

8 (1) the above- and below-ground forest carbon
9 stocks and stock changes associated with species
10 composition, forest management regime, and land-
11 owner types, including small area estimations for re-
12 gional and localized geographies across the United
13 States, made available through Forest Inventory and
14 Analysis updates and annual reports;

15 (2) the embodied carbon involved in the manu-
16 facture of products, using data from published envi-
17 ronmental product declarations and life cycle assess-
18 ments, updated as new and more refined data be-
19 comes available;

20 (3) the long-term stored carbon in manufac-
21 tured timber products; and

22 (4) the carbon displacement of wood products,
23 compared to other materials, using substitution fac-
24 tors.

1 (d) TIMEFRAME.—To the maximum extent prac-
2 ticable, the Secretary shall establish the platform under
3 subsection (a) not later than 2 years after the date of en-
4 actment of this Act.

5 **SEC. 4. WOOD INNOVATION GRANT PROGRAM.**

6 Section 8643 of the Agriculture Improvement Act of
7 2018 (7 U.S.C. 7655d) is amended—

8 (1) in subsection (d), by inserting “50 percent
9 of” before “the amount”; and

10 (2) by striking subsection (c) and inserting the
11 following:

12 “(c) TARGETING TO SUPPORT ECONOMIC DEVELOP-
13 MENT, ENHANCED BUILDING DESIGN, AND IMPACT AS-
14 SESSMENT.—In selecting among proposals of eligible enti-
15 ties under subsection (b)(2), the Secretary may give pri-
16 ority to proposals for projects that—

17 “(1) include the use or retrofitting (or both) of
18 existing sawmill facilities located in counties in
19 which the average annual unemployment rate ex-
20 ceeded the national average unemployment rate by
21 more than 1 percent in the previous calendar year;

22 “(2) recognize or enhance carbon reduction
23 strategies in building design, including forest im-
24 pacts, which can be improved or incentivized by
25 North American procurement; or

1 “(3) report on the connection between their
2 proposal and the resilience and economic benefits as-
3 sociated with wood products from anticipated wood
4 supply areas, including wildfire risk reduction, in-
5 creased fiber flow, forest or mill jobs, and support
6 for forested communities created because of forest
7 management.”.

8 **SEC. 5. WOOD BUILDING EDUCATION ACCELERATOR**
9 **GRANT PROGRAM.**

10 (a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

11 (1) ELIGIBLE ENTITY.—The term “eligible enti-
12 ty” means—

13 (A) an engineering, architecture, or design
14 school at an institution of higher education; or

15 (B) a center of excellence that consists of
16 1 or more partnerships between forestry, engi-
17 neering, architecture, or business schools at 1
18 or more institutions of higher education.

19 (2) SECRETARY.—The term “Secretary” means
20 the Secretary, acting through the Research and De-
21 velopment deputy area and the State, Private, and
22 Tribal Forestry deputy area of the Forest Service.

23 (b) GRANT PROGRAM.—

24 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall establish
25 a program, to be known as the “Wood Building

1 Education Accelerator Grant Program”, to annually
2 award grants to geographically diverse eligible enti-
3 ties to support the development of curricula, pro-
4 grams, and best practices relating to the critical ele-
5 ments of designing and building with wood, includ-
6 ing the use of traditional wood products, mass tim-
7 ber, and other advanced wood products.

8 (2) PROPOSALS.—To be eligible to receive a
9 grant under this subsection, an eligible entity shall
10 submit to the Secretary a proposal at such time, in
11 such manner, and containing such information as
12 the Secretary may require.

13 (3) REVIEW AND AWARDS.—The Secretary shall
14 review proposals submitted under paragraph (2),
15 and award grants under this subsection, in consulta-
16 tion with nonprofit organizations, research organiza-
17 tions, or other private entities providing funding to
18 eligible entities to support activities carried out
19 using grants under this section.

20 (c) MATCHING REQUIREMENT.—As a condition of re-
21 ceiving a grant under subsection (b)(1), an eligible entity
22 shall provide funds equal to the amount received by the
23 eligible entity under the grant, to be derived from non-
24 Federal sources.

1 (d) LIMITATION ON AMOUNT.—The total amount of
2 grants awarded under subsection (b)(1) shall be not more
3 than \$10,000,000 for each fiscal year.

4 (e) ALLOCATION.—Subject to the availability of ap-
5 propriations made in advance for such purposes, the Sec-
6 retary shall allocate to carry out this section not more
7 than \$5,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2024 through
8 2028.

9 **SEC. 6. RURAL INFRASTRUCTURE AND BUILDING PILOT**
10 **PROGRAM.**

11 (a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

12 (1) ELIGIBLE ENTITY.—The term “eligible enti-
13 ty” means—

14 (A) a nonprofit organization;

15 (B) a community-based organization;

16 (C) a State, local, or municipal govern-
17 ment;

18 (D) a tribally designated housing author-
19 ity;

20 (E) a private entity, as determined by the
21 Secretary; and

22 (F) a consortium of 2 or more entities de-
23 scribed in subparagraphs (A) through (E).

24 (2) PRODUCED AND ASSEMBLED IN THE
25 UNITED STATES.—The term “produced and assem-

1 bled in the United States”, with regard to wood ma-
2 terials, means that—

3 (A) the wood materials, if manufactured,
4 were manufactured entirely in the United
5 States; and

6 (B) if the wood materials were produced,
7 all production occurred entirely in the United
8 States.

9 (3) PUBLIC AGENCY.—The term “public agen-
10 cy” means a department, agency, other unit, or in-
11 strumentality of Federal, State, Tribal, or local gov-
12 ernment.

13 (4) RURAL.—The term “rural” has the mean-
14 ing given the term in section 343(a) of the Consoli-
15 dated Farm and Rural Development Act (7 U.S.C.
16 1991(a)).

17 (5) SECRETARY.—The term “Secretary” means
18 the Secretary of Agriculture, acting through the
19 Under Secretary for Rural Development, in con-
20 sultation with the Under Secretary for Natural Re-
21 sources and Environment.

22 (b) GRANT PROGRAM.—

23 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall award
24 grants to eligible entities to carry out pilot projects
25 to demonstrate the use of innovative wood products,

1 systems, and technologies, such as mass timber, in
2 the construction and renovation of rural infrastruc-
3 ture and building projects.

4 (2) APPLICATIONS.—To be eligible to receive a
5 grant under this subsection, an eligible entity shall
6 submit to the Secretary an application at such time,
7 in such manner, and containing such information as
8 the Secretary may require.

9 (c) PROJECT REQUIREMENTS.—A pilot project car-
10 ried out using a grant received under subsection (b)(1)
11 shall—

12 (1) be not longer than 5 years;

13 (2) include collaboration between 1 or more eli-
14 gible entities and 1 or more public agencies;

15 (3) primarily use for construction materials
16 wood products that are manufactured and prefab-
17 ricated offsite and assembled onsite as a “kit-of-
18 parts” or by assembling finished modules;

19 (4) to the extent practicable, use wood mate-
20 rials that are produced and assembled in the United
21 States; and

22 (5) be located in or provide benefits to a rural
23 community that, to the extent practicable, has a his-
24 tory in wood products manufacturing.

1 (d) MATCHING REQUIREMENT.—As a condition of re-
2 ceiving a grant under subsection (b)(1), an eligible entity
3 shall provide funds, to be derived from non-Federal
4 sources—

5 (1) except as provided in paragraph (2), equal
6 to the amount received by the eligible entity under
7 the grant; or

8 (2) in the case of a pilot project serving a popu-
9 lation of—

10 (A) less than 19,000 residents, equal to 50
11 percent of the amount received by the eligible
12 entity under the grant; or

13 (B) less than 2,500 residents, equal to 25
14 percent of the amount received by the eligible
15 entity under the grant.

16 (e) LIMITATION ON AMOUNT.—The total amount of
17 grants awarded under subsection (b)(1) shall be not more
18 than \$10,000,000 for each fiscal year.

19 (f) EVALUATION.—The Secretary shall provide for an
20 independent evaluation of pilot projects carried out under
21 this section that includes—

22 (1) a summary of the activities conducted under
23 the pilot projects;

24 (2) an assessment of the effectiveness of the
25 project requirements described in subsection (c); and

1 (3) best practices regarding the use of public-
2 private partnerships for increased wood utilization to
3 benefit rural communities.

4 (g) ALLOCATION.—Subject to the availability of ap-
5 propriations made in advance for such purposes, the Sec-
6 retary shall allocate to carry out this section not more
7 than \$10,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2024 through
8 2028.
